The Breast Unit in Ferrara

And the Diagnostic Therapeutic Care Pathway (PDTA) For breast cancer





Dear Madam(s),

You have been invited for an examination because after having seen your last mammogram or ultrasound scan the need arose to further investigations.

We offer you this brochure to give you some practical clarifications on the path envisaged in these cases by the Senology Centre of the Health Authorities in our province.

The Senology Centre, recognised by the Emilia-Romagna Region, is the structure that ensures the active care of patients for whom a clinical suspicion has been detected. of Breast Cancer and operates according to the standards defined by the European Society of Specialists in Breast Oncology.

The Senology Centre (also called 'Breast Unit') consists of by a multidisciplinary group of specialists belonging to the Azienda University Hospital and the Local Health Authority of Ferrara who collaborate and work together through the Diagnostic and Therapeutic and Treatment Pathway (PDTA) of the Breast.



The overall objective of the PDTA is to take care of you in order to complete the diagnosis, define and possibly carry out the most appropriate therapy. The group of specialists, consisting of breast radiologists, anatomic pathologists nuclear physicians, breast and plastic surgeons, oncologists, radiotherapists oncologists, psycho-oncologists, geneticists, physiatrists and nurses will work together to be able to perform, quickly and with as little inconvenience as possible, all the procedures necessary for your case.

If you rely on the PDTA, a nurse in charge of your case will be in charge of you and will organise all subsequent appointments for tests or medical check-ups. There is no need for you to make appointments or bothering to look for specialists: everything will be organised automatically, with minimum inconvenience.

The Breast Unit's in-house professionals are also joined by Associations representing patients who operate in our area ,and who collaborate in support activities during the diagnosis and therapies and during the post-diagnosis phase, to encourage full psychophysical recovery. 1. EQUAL ACCESS

Equal access to affordable and optimal cancer care, including the right to a second opinion.



2. INFORMATION

disease and treatment from your medical team and other reliable sources, including patient and professional organisations.



3. QUALITY,

information about the quality and safety of care, the level of expertise and the autoomes achieved to your type of cancer in the centre where you are being treated.



4. SPECIALISED MULTIDISCIPLINARY

Receive care from a specialised multidisciplinary team, deally as part of a cancel care network



DECISION-MAKING

Participate in shared decision-making with your healthcare team about all aspects of your treatment and care.



INNOVATION

Be informed about ongoing research relevant to you, and your ability and eligibility to participate in research.



7. QUALITY OF LIFE

Discuss with your healthcare team your priorities and preferences to achieve the best possible quality of life.



8. INTEGRATED SUPPORTIVE &

Receive optimal supportive and palliative care, as relevant, during any part of your cancer journey.



9. SURVIVORSHIP &

Receive and discuss with your care team a clear, managed and achievable plan for your survivorship and rehabilitation.



10. REINTEGRATIO

Be fully reintegrated into society and protected from cancer-related stigma and discrimination, so that, in so far as is possible, you can return to a normal life.

Who is the contact nurse?

The contact nurse (also called case manager) is the nurse who will follow you throughout the whole process.

Step by step, the nurse will organise, the various appointments and accesses in your treatment care and will be the link between you and the specialists.

You may contact the nurse for any further information about the illness and the function of the Senology Centre, or for any other need.

Who checks the test you have done?

The result of the tests will be assessed by the specialists at the Senology Centre, who discuss each individual case and find the best course of action in view of the diagnosis, its characteristics and needs.

At the end of the brochure you will find the list of locations where the activities of the Senology Centre.

Who notifies you of the result of the tests (report)?

The result of the tests and any treatment proposal will be communicated to you within 10 days.

You will be contacted by telephone by the referring nurse who will explain when and where to pick up the report. Normally the reports are delivered to the **outpatient at the senology** clinic, which is located in sector 1, block D, floor 1 (1D1) of the Cona Hospital.

On that occasion you will meet a doctor from the Senology Centre, together with the nurse (case manager) and will receive all the explanations about the diagnosis and possible therapies suitable for your case, already discussed and evaluated by the multidisciplinary team.

Remember...

You may also discuss, during the meeting or afterwards, the indications for the treatments that will be proposed to you.

Since on these occasions it can happen that youforget something, it would be useful to ask a family member (or friend) to accompany you.

Two people remember better!



What will happen after you get the result of the tests?

If the result of the tests does not reveal any particular problems, you will be recommended for follow-up examinations in the following months and years to come. If, on the other hand, it is breast cancer, the doctor will advise you on how to deal with the situation.

This may usually be necessary:

- surgically remove the diseased area;
- have medical treatment, before or after surgery;
- receive radiotherapy on the breast in some cases.

You may discuss treatments or possible alternatives with the specialist at the Senology Centre and with the referring nurse during the meeting; if you want further explanations we can meet you at another time. During the course of the treatment you will be provided with information on each stage of treatment, both in-depth information on the different therapies and of a practical nature.

Whatever the need for therapy, everything will be organised automatically.

You can always choose...

your general practitioner, unless you express indication, will be constantly informed on the results of examinations, the treatment programme and the different stages of treatment. You will in any case be entirely free to choose to carry out treatments at this or another specialised facility: if you prefer to be followed in another centre, we will still provide you with the results of the examinations performed and the treatment programme proposed by our specialists.

- Oncological radiotherapy: Cona Hospital.
